Our 2025 Class Placement Process

As we prepare to organise classes for 2025, I'd like to share our approach and ask for your input on any important information we should consider for your tamariki.

Last year, we asked whānau to complete a friendship survey with their tamariki and while the intention was to support friendships, it added significant complexity to an already challenging process. This year, we're taking a different approach to ensure we continue to consider friendships while managing the placement process effectively.

Each child will create a friendship circle with their teacher, identifying peers (at their own year level) they enjoy learning and playing with. Teachers will support children to think beyond their current class and consider those across other classes. This approach helps us ensure that tamariki are placed with friends in a way that supports their learning and social growth.

How whānau can contribute

We value your insights and invite you to share any significant information about your child that could impact their placement. For example, is something at home affecting your child at school?

Please avoid specific requests for teachers or friends. Our goal is to create balanced classes while considering gender, skill levels, social dynamics, learning needs along with previous teachers.

What to expect

Assigning tamariki to classes is a task we approach with great care and thought. While we cannot guarantee every child will be placed with their 'best' friend, we will do our utmost to ensure they are with at least one current friend. As a relatively small kura, tamariki often have the opportunity to be in the same class with their friends in future years. We also ask that you remember there will be countless opportunities for tamariki to connect with their friends during break times, sports, and other school activities.

This balanced approach helps us support both existing friendships and the formation of new connections, ensuring a positive and inclusive learning environment.
